Rules and Regulations **Table Tennis**

1. LAW OF THE GAME

The competition shall be conducted to the best effort in accordance with the laws of the game as approved by the International Table Tennis Federation.

2. REPRESENTATION

- a) Each team may be represented by a maximum of 6 men and 6 ladies players.
- b) No repetition of players is allowed i.e. each team shall have a minimum of 4 men and 4 ladies.

3. FORMAT

- Man Singles
- Woman Singles
- Men Doubles
- Women Doubles
- Mixed Doubles

4. GENERAL RULES / SCORE

- a) Team captains are required to submit team line-ups at least 10 minutes before every match to the convener and no changes are allowed thereafter.
- b) Teams must report to the convener 15 minutes before the scheduled time.
- c) No grace time will be given unless agreed by the opponent team. Extra cost for booking of additional tables will be borne by the latecomers.
- d) At the time of reporting the captains of each team must submit the final list of players (including reserves) for the day.
- e) Table tennis balls (40+) will be provided for competition. No table tennis bats will be provided at the competition venue.
- f) 2 separate groups will be drawn by ISCA and round robin will be played within the two groups. The top two teams of each group will then proceed to the semi-finals, with 1st of group A against 2nd of group B and 2nd of group A against 1st of group B.
- g) Winners in the semi-finals will proceed to finals.
- h) Each match shall be played best of 3 sets for matches before semi-finals and best of 5 sets for semi-final and final matches. Each set is a race to 11 points.
- i) Point system for each game: win – 2 points, lose – 1 point, walkover – 0 point. In an event there is two or more teams with the same accumulated points, the difference in number of matches won will be used to decide the placing.

- j) If a player fails to turn up for his match, he may not be replaced by another player. Their match will be forfeited and a win of 2-0 (sets) will be awarded to the opposing teams for matches before semi-finals, and a win of 3-0 (sets) will be awarded to the opposing teams for semi-final matches and final match. A player/pair may claim a time-out period of up to 1 minute during a match.

5. REFRESHMENT

All teams are to provide their own refreshments.
