Mr Benny Lim, Chairman, National Parks Board

Mr Lim started his career as a police constable and rose through the ranks to become Deputy Commissioner of Police. He was Director of the Internal Security Department and led and developed Singapore's counter-terrorism efforts against the jihadist terrorist threat. He later became the Permanent Secretary at several Ministries. As Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Home Affairs, he established the Home Team Academy and its Behavioural Science Centre, and during his term, saw crime, drug, fire fatality and recidivism rates improved to be amongst the lowest in the world. As Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of National Development, he strengthened feedback and data analytics capabilities and reviewed housing schemes to meet changing needs. Concurrently, as Permanent Secretary of the Prime Minister's Office (PMO), he oversaw strategic national security and intelligence programmes as well as drove efforts in engaging Singaporeans in the Our Singapore Conversation and organised the SG50 "Future of Us" Exhibition. Mr Lim is currently Chairman of National Parks Board.



Mr David Chew, Director, Commercial Affairs Department of the Singapore Police Force

Mr Chew joined the Attorney-Chambers in 1992. He graduated with an LLB (Hons) from the National University of Singapore in 1991 and worked as a litigation lawyer prior to joining the State Courts in 1992 as a Magistrate and thereafter as a District Judge. He was posted to the Attorney-General's Chambers in 1999.

Mr Chew is currently the Director of the Commercial Affairs Department of the Singapore Police Force. He was previously Deputy Chief Prosecutor of the Financial and Technology Crime Divisions at AGC. Prior to that, he was attached as an in-house Deputy Public Prosecutor at Chambers' satellite office in the Commercial Affairs Department. Mr Chew also served as a District Judge (Juvenile Court) and as a Deputy Registrar in the State Courts (formerly known as the Subordinate Courts).



Wong Hong Kuan, Director, Corrupt Practices Investigation Bureau

Mr Wong has held many appointments within and outside the Singapore Police Force (SPF) since he started his career in the public sector in 1995. These included Director of Operations in the SPF, Commander of Bedok Police Division, Commander of Police Training Command and Deputy Commissioner of Police (Policy). He also served as Assistant Director (Infrastructure & Economy) in the Ministry of Finance. In his last appointment as the Chief Executive Officer of the Workforce Development Agency (WDA), Mr Wong was responsible in leading and championing the workforce development, enhancing the employability and competitiveness of Singapore's workforce. In addition, Mr Wong has contributed to the community through his involvement with the National Committee on Youth Guidance and Rehabilitation, the National Police Cadet Corps Council, the National Crime Prevention Council.

Mr Wong is currently Director of the Corrupt Practices Investigation Bureau and will be posted to the Ministry of National Development as Deputy Secretary (Development) on 1 October 2018.
